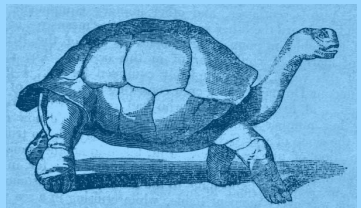
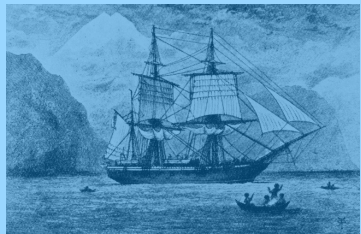


John Henslow and the Education of Charles Darwin
